1. Scholarship Program: Undergraduate Research Assistantship Program

Criteria: Credits \geq 60
STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) major
GPA \geq 3.0
Full time student

Financial Support: Lower Juniors - \$3,000/academic year
Upper Juniors - \$4,000/academic year
Seniors - \$5,000/academic year

2. Scholarship Program: Graduate Research Assistantship Program

Criteria: STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) major
GPA \geq 3.0
Full time student

Financial Support: First Yr – Masters - \$6,000/academic yr, PhD - \$8,000/academic yr
Second Yr – Masters - \$7,000/academic yr, PhD - \$9,000/academic yr

3. Scholarship Program: Bridge to the Doctorate Program

Criteria: LSAMP Undergraduate Scholar interested in Graduate school
