



Governor Mario M. Cuomo today announced the nomination and Senate confirmation of Harry W. Albright Jr., former Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of the Dime Savings Bank of New York, and Martin S. Begun, Associate Dean of New York University School of Medicine, as members of the Battery Park City Authority.

Mr. Albright, of North Tarrytown, most recently served as Chief Executive Officer of The Dime Savings Bank and as Chairman of the Board before retiring this year. Previously, he worked as State Superintendent of Banks from 1972 to 1974. Mr. Albright was originally named to the Authority last year and was selected chair by the members of the Authority following his confirmation at that time.

He is a member of the Governor's Council on Fiscal and Economic Priorities and the Governor's Real Estate Advisory Board. Mr. Albright has also served as co-chair of the Governor's Housing Task Force. He is a board member of the City University of New York Construction Fund, as well as numerous banking, educational and non-profit organizations.

In addition to his role as Associate Dean at NYU Medical Center, Mr. Begun is also Vice President of External Affairs, and an Associate Professor in Medical Administration at the University. He serves as Chairman and member of the New York City Mental Health Board in the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Alcoholism Services.

Mr. Begun has also served on numerous boards and committees related to the administration of medical facilities and the legal problems of the mentally ill, and has received several awards for his work.

The Battery Park Authority, created in 1968 by the State Legislature, is responsible for the planning and development of the 92-acre Battery Park City in Manhattan.

Nominations to the Authority are subject to Senate confirmation, and members currently receive \$100 per diem, not to exceed \$5,000 annually.

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
