About the College

Baruch College, formerly the Baruch School of Business and Public Administration of The City College of New York, was established as an independent four-year college in the City University system in July, 1968 by action of the Board of Higher Education and the State Board of Regents.

The College currently offers undergraduate and advanced programs in business, public administration, and education. In the Fall of 1969, it will initiate a general liberal arts program leading to degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, and Master of Science. Now housed in a 16-story building at 23rd Street and Lexington Avenue, with a graduate center at 257 Park Avenue South, the College will ultimately develop a new campus on an urban renewal site near Downtown Brooklyn. Currently, Baruch College enrolls approximately 2,600 full-time day students and 10,000 evening students.
