DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT OF THE ACTIVITIES, ACCOMPLISHMENTS, AND PLANS

As we look back on the 2024–2025 academic year, I'm proud to reflect on another impactful and productive year for the Steven L. Newman Real Estate Institute. I'm especially grateful to our students, faculty, staff, advisory board, and industry partners for their continued engagement and support.

This year, we hosted a dynamic lineup of career events designed to connect our students with industry professionals. Highlights included career panels featuring the NYC Department of Housing Preservation & Development (HPD), Brookfield Properties, ICSC, MBA of NY, Silverstein Properties, Rose Associates, and the Alumni Career Panel. Particularly, through our Coffee Connect event (Advisory Board Mentoring Program) and the Advisory Board Speaker Series, our students engaged directly with advisory board members, building valuable industry connections.

The Steven L. Newman Real Estate Institute pursues applied and timely research on critical real estate and public policy issues based on an interdisciplinary approach. During the AY 2024-2025, we published the New York City Housing Market Trends Reports on a quarterly basis for 2024 Q2, 2024 Q3, 2024 Q4, and 2025 Q1). The next report (2025 Q2) is scheduled for July. We also provided fee-based research consulting on New York City Multifamily Market Trends. **We recently renewed our partnership agreement with a NYC-based real estate firm to provide the market reports for another year.** The next report (2025 Q2) is scheduled for July.

In addition to our quarterly report series, we published the second edition of our industry report examining the housing market in Onondaga County, New York, following the establishment of the leading semiconductor manufacturer Micron's new "Megafab" factory in the region.

In the upcoming academic year (AY 2025–2026), we plan to launch the **Real Estate Research Brief Series**, which will feature curated summaries of recent research and discussions on selected real estate topics. We will continue to share our research findings through publications, newsletters, and conferences.

The Steven L. Newman Real Estate Institute also plans to participate in the New York City Real Estate Expo in October 2025, offering professional education and industry-focused sessions—such as panels—on topics at the intersection of AI and real estate. Detailed programming is currently under development and will be posted on the Institute's website.

GOALS AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR AY 2025-2026 AND BEYOND

REAL ESTATE RESEARCH BRIEF SERIES

In the upcoming academic year (AY 2025–2026), we plan to launch the Real Estate Research Brief Series, which will feature curated summaries of recent research and discussions on selected real estate topics.

SEEKING RESEARCH GRANTS

As part of the Newman Institute’s strategy to achieve greater financial self-sufficiency, we aim to expand our effort to secure more grant-based research opportunities—not only within CUNY, but also from external sources such as government agencies, nonprofit organizations, and real estate firms.

ADVANCED CERTIFICATE IN REAL ESTATE FINANCE (STARTING SEMESTER: FALL 2025)

The Department of Real Estate faculty approved moving our certificate program from NREI to Zicklin School of Business. The proposal was also approved at the Baruch Faculty Meeting in May 2024, and approved by CUNY. The *Advanced Certificate in Real Estate Finance* will provide an in-depth look into major concepts, principles, and tools useful for making investment and finance decisions regarding real estate assets. This certificate also addresses the challenges and possibilities of real estate finance from various angles, such as investment and development perspectives. Courses include Real Estate Finance, Real Estate Capital Markets, and Real Estate Development. Upon successful completion of the program, students will receive a professional Certificate in Real Estate Finance. The curriculum for this advanced certificate program is a subset of the courses available in the MS in Real Estate program, thus potentially allowing the students the option to apply to and enroll in Zicklin’s Master’s level programs subsequent to earning the certificate.

CHALLENGES

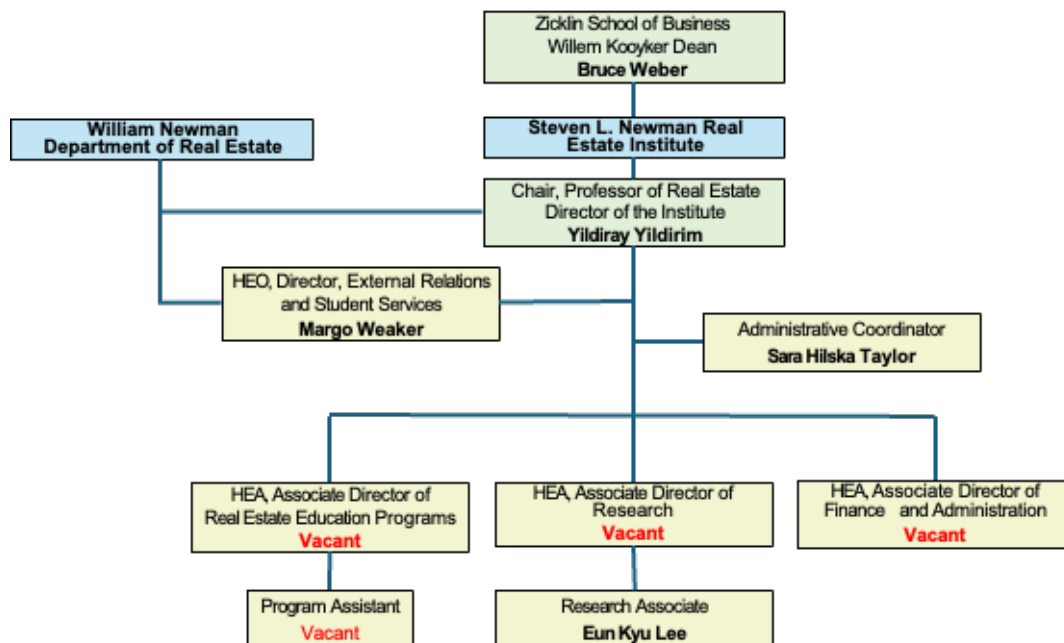
A major challenge in running the Steven L. Newman Real Estate Institute is that it is significantly understaffed to increase impactful activities. Until 2015, NREI was run by 11 staff members, including a director and two HEA positions specified per a donor's gift agreement. However, the Institute lost the two HEA positions and is now run by only less staff members: a director (also the chair of the department), a director of external relations and student services (also mainly part of the department), an administrative coordinator, and a research associate (also help with department needs).

The understaffed workforce is currently handling a wider range of scope than in the past. The Department of Real Estate also faces the same challenge regarding hiring full-time faculty. We must hire additional one or two (not replacement) associate/professors to increase our research productivity and the tenure-track faculty ratio regarding adjunct faculty. The adjunct faculty teaches all of our MS Real Estate courses.

The Institute aims to achieve its strategic goal by offering applied research, professional education (such as AI in Real Estate), and hosting conferences, including various in-house networking events and panels with the real estate associations. Additionally, we seek to expand our presence within the industry by providing third-party research and consultancy services with student involvement.

Moreover, our department's curriculum is dynamically updated to reflect the evolving needs of the real estate market and insights from NREI board members. For instance, we introduced a new elective on ESG and Sustainability in Real Estate in Fall 2023 and offered its graduate version in Fall 2024.
